Hunting Season & the Upper Mattaponi Wildlife Management Code

This hunting season, the Upper Mattaponi Tribe is excited to introduce the new Wildlife Management Code. This law, adopted on September 28, 2024, aims to protect our hunting, fishing, and gathering rights while ensuring we care for our fish, wildlife, and plants.

The Code was developed after several listening sessions with tribal citizens and collaboration with the Governance and Administration Committee before being reviewed and passed by the UMT Council. It is available on the Tribe's Open Law Library.

The Tribe is working to establish a Wildlife Commission to oversee these rules. Until then, hunters are encouraged to read the Code, as it contains important interim regulations for this season. The new regulations will help sustain the tribal community by ensuring responsible hunting on tribal lands and protecting our natural environment for future generations. 

Environmental Team Expansion

The Environmental Department has undergone new and exciting changes this summer!

Two staff members transitioned into leadership roles: Andria "Andi" Greene is now the Environmental Director, and Conor Real serves as the Environmental Operations Manager. The team also expanded, welcoming Environmental Specialist Liz Buikema, who brings expertise in water resources, and Carrie Fox (Pamunkey), who will join in October as a Seasonal Fisheries Technician to assist with juvenile Atlantic Sturgeon sampling in the Mattaponi River. Alongside Johnathan Oxendine (Haliwa-Saponi) and Lane Eubank (Chickahominy), the team works to reconnect tribal citizens with their historic lands by studying, managing, and reacquiring ancestral resources. Ongoing scientific activities include water sampling across 1,300 acres of tribal land and establishing an air quality monitoring station.
